Purpose: To explore the theoretical and methodological principles, organizational and legal mechanism of money, credit and banking functioning in the market economy.

Objective: To determine the nature, functions and role of money and credit, mechanism of the monetary system functioning in a market economy, the laws of the foreign exchange market and monetary system, money market, the role of assimilation, specificity and practice of using monetary policy of the central bank, banks' activities and non-bank financial institutions on monetary services businesses and people in Ukraine.

Subject: money and banking system as the central units of money market infrastructure.

Content of the subject is revealed in the topics: Nature and functions of money. Money and cash flows. Money market. Cash systems. Inflation and monetary reforms. Forex market and currency systems. Mechanism of the money supply and monetary policy. The role of money in a market economy. Theory of money. Nature and functions of credit. Forms, types and role of credit. Theoretical foundations of interests. Financial intermediation of the money market. The theoretical basis of commercial banks activity. Central banks in the monetary system and banking management. International financial institutions and their cooperation with Ukraine.

Supporting lectures and practical classes: computer, multimedia equipment, didactic materials.

Assessment: written test, performance of individual tasks, test, lecture and practical modules, examination.

Teaching methods: interactive (thought-provoking) lectures, role plays, case-studies, business simulations
